Appeal of Unlawful Withholding of Official State Agency Mail

Summary

The ODRC has repeatedly insisted that I am Monkey #4 of the Army of the 12 Monkeys and has declared that I will remain Monkey #4 for the rest of my life, no matter what I may do. This means that, against my will, I have been made the "leader" of the Army of the 12 Monkeys.

On or about 10 October 2017, I prepared the legal documents sent to me by the Ohio Secretary of State Jon Husted for registering the trademark name, "The Army of the 12 Monkeys," and for registering the group as an unincorporated association. I included the Constitution of the Army of the 12 Monkeys, attached as Exhibit 14. I included a cash slip (Exhibit 15) which was approved by the warden's designee for the filing fees, and it was mailed to the Ohio Secretary of State for that office's processing according to Ohio statute (Exhibit 16).

Upon legal processing, the Ohio Secretary of State returned the legal documentation, which was withheld by the WCI mailroom in notices of withholding #129 and #130, related to trade name registration and unincorporated association registration, respectively.

I contend the withholding is improper and unlawful for the following reasons argued herein:

1. The appropriate form was not used for withholding, as the current form lists criteria for withholding printed material-- criteria that are approved by the decision of the U.S. Supreme Court in Thornburgh v. Abbott, and the criteria for withholding such material does not include the dubious reasons included on these improper forms.

2. The forms indicate that I am "not allowed" to conduct business. Registration of a trademark and registration of an unincorporated association which may or may not conduct business at some future time does not constitute "conducting business." Registration merely provides for the potential to conduct business, the way a marriage license provides for the possibility of getting married or a driver's license provides for the potential to drive.

3. Pursuant to Jones v. North Carolina Prisoner Labor Union, membership in a group and its registration does not constitute activity that prison officials have a "legitimate interest" in "regulating." Only group activity beyond mere identification or membership is punishable by prison authorities.

4. The forms indicate I am not permitted to "establish a group" without the warden's permission. As point of fact, the ODRC has already determined that I "established" the "group" in 2012. It is already established. Registration of the group is not its establishment, but is, rather, the legal pursuit of gaining legal status for the group that the ODRC already concedes is "established." No rule exists that requires me to get prior authorization to avail myself of the legal process of registering an already-existing group or to establish the trademark over a trade name.

5. Even if we accept the legitimacy of the rationale for withholding, and even if we agree that I require prior authorization from the warden, exhibits 15 and 16 demonstrate that I submitted this paperwork to the warden's designee and received approval before the warden's designee drafted the check for the filing fees and sealed the envelope and mailed my request to the Secretary of State. So, I proceeded in good faith with approval from the warden's designee.

6. Even if we accept the rationale provided, and even if we conclude that I proceeded without authority, withholding the documents mailed to me by the Secretary of State does not undo the legal process that has already been undertaken. That is, registration that has already happened will not be undone by merely withholding the forms sent by the Secretary of State. So, withholding the forms not only serves no purpose for the institution, it accomplishes absolutely nothing.

7. Withholding these forms constitutes interference with official mailings from a state agency. It is criminal.

8. Withholding these forms constitutes obstruction of federal mail. It is criminal.

9. Withholding these forms constitutes interference with an animal enterprise. It is criminal. Because I have registered the Army of the 12 Monkeys as an "animal enterprise" as defined by federal statute, and because I am the "Authorized Agent" for purposes of state agency mail, the obstruction of mail from a state agency to me, as the Authorized Agent of the Army of the 12 Monkeys, constitutes "interference with an animal enterprise," a federal felony. Interference with an animal enterprise carries a federal terrorism specification, which requires a minimum of a twenty-year sentence if convicted.

10. If this appeal is denied, the institution's only other option is to destroy the documents after ten days. Such destruction requires approval by the county probate court, which I have already contacted in order to challenge any request for approval. Destruction without the order will result in another civil action in the Ohio Court of Claims that will cost the ODRC \$12,000 from its operating budget in order to secure representation by the Ohio Attorney General, followed by a loss of the action which could cost as much as \$50,000. Further, all of this will be copied and posted online with full explanations as to the illegality of the withholding, as well as continuing updates in globally-syndicated radio segments. It may, in time, involve a team of attorneys paid by the revenues from my book which has recently been published. Or, you can give me state agency mail that (1) never should have been withheld, (2) serves no purpose whatsoever in being withheld since I can continue pursuing the next legal step and the next without the forms you withhold, (3) is irrelevant to the registration that has already occurred, and (4) constitutes all kinds of criminal behavior AND creates litigation that will likely result in a court not permitting destruction AND result in further civil litigation that will take a significant chunk of funding out of the ODRC's general fund, and (5) prove fairly embarrassing.

I say all of that not as an attempt at EXTORTION, but to provide a full context for whomever makes the decision to either affirm or reverse the decision to withhold state agency official mail. That way, whatever happens, no one can claim they did not know the ramifications of their (criminal?) actions.

1. Appropriate form.

The notices of withholding challenged here were documented on obsolete forms. The forms used here are DRC 4149 forms that were last updated in 1995. These forms were replaced by the current notices of withholding that list all of the criteria for withholding that have been approved by federal courts.

The forms used here do not contain those criteria, and the rationale that was provided on these obsolete forms do not conform to the criteria for withholding that appear on the proper forms and are described in OAC §5120-9-19, Printed Material.

As point of fact, the Ohio Secretary of State's official forms are printed material. They must conform to the criteria of §5120-9-19. Thus, the notices and the rationales that are described on those notices are contrary to administrative regulations.

2. The rationale that I am "not allowed" to "conduct business."

Registration of an unincorporated association is not conducting business. First, not all unincorporated associations are formed as businesses. Second,

even those unincorporated associations formed for conducting business must first register with the Ohio Secretary of State before conducting business. The registration of an unincorporated association is akin to paying for a marriage license or obtaining a driver's license. The receipt of a marriage license does not constitute "getting married," and the receipt of a driver's license does not constitute "driving."

Here, mailroom staff have confused "apples" and "oranges." I have a constitutional right to be a member of any group I choose to join. Prison officials have no interest in regulating mere membership-- which is why I can join a union and I am a member in a union right now. But, if I am a member in a carpenter's union, I do not require prior approval from the warden, as no one will assert that I intend to climb on the roof and nail shingles to it.

In this case, the organization in question is "The Army of the 12 Monkeys," which is registered as an "animal enterprise" pursuant to federal statutes. Does the mailroom contend that it is my intention that, while here at the prison, I will engage in cosmetic experiments on animals? That I will pursue the "business activities" of an "animal enterprise"? I assure you that I will not. And, I promise that if I intend to put lipstick on gerbils, I will request permission from the warden first.

3. Membership vs. Activity.

The U.S. Supreme Court has ruled that I have a right to join even a union, so long as I do not undertake union activities such as recruiting that would be disruptive to the prison environment. So, your courts make a distinction between mere "membership," and "activity." I have a constitutional right to be part of an organization that exists beyond the confines of the prison and to register the organization and to avail myself of the quasi-legal processes offered by state agencies to afford myself legal protections and legal status for myself and for organizations to which I am a member. Seeking and obtaining such legal recognition by state agencies does not constitute "activity" that prison officials have an interest in regulating or prohibiting. See, Jones v. North Carolina Prison Labor Union, 433 U.S. 119 (1977).

4. Disallowance to "establish a group."

I was first accused of "establishing" the Army of the 12 Monkeys in MANCI-12-007219. See, Exhibit 1. When that conviction was overturned, I was re-charged in MANCI-13-002907, Exhibit 2. I was found guilty of rule violations. See, Exhibit 3. My appeals were denied. See, Exhibit 4 and 5. I was recommended transfer to the super-duper-max as a "co-creator" of the "12 Monkeys." See, Exhibit 6, page 3, Section D. See also, Exhibit 7, "Justification," where I am identified as a "creator" of the "12 Monkeys."

As these ODRC documents clearly and unequivocally demonstrate, I "created" or "established" the "Army of the 12 Monkeys" five years ago. The "creation" or "establishment" of the organization is already done-- and I was already given a conduct report (two of them), which means I cannot again be subjected to sanctions for "establishing" or "creating" the Army of the 12 Monkeys.

Further, this institution is well aware of the pre-existence of the Army of the 12 Monkeys. Exhibits 8 through 11 are correspondence between myself and ODRC Counsel Trevor Clark, which relate to two meetings here at the prison for which then-investigator Greg Craft was present. Exhibits 12 and 13 are documents from WCI-16-000885, where this institution found guilt for rule violations for my alleged involvement in the Army of the 12 Monkeys. This means this institution knew of the existence of the Army of the 12 Monkeys in 2016.

Naturally, the question arises: If the ODRC contends I "established" the Army of the 12 Monkeys in 2012, and if WCI contends I was an active member of an existing group called the Army of the 12 Monkeys in 2016, how, in 2017, is the mailroom forbidding me from "establishing" something that everyone knows already exists? How am I being prevented from creating something we are all in agreement I already created and is already created?

Is that not akin to trying to shove the proverbial poop back into the donkey?

As point of fact, I am not, in 2017, attempting to "create" or "establish" the Army of the 12 Monkeys. I am perfectly content to agree with the ODRC and to concede that I did all of that half of a decade ago. What I am attempting to do is to register the Army of the 12 Monkeys with the Ohio Secretary of State and to avail myself to a quasi-legal process that provides me and the organization I "established" five years ago certain legal recognition and legal status that the state provides.

No rule of conduct requires me to request or obtain permission from the warden or anyone else to avail myself to quasi-legal processes offered by state agencies. As point of fact, the Ohio Secretary of State is an elected official whose authority is governed by state statute. The legal recognitions that the Secretary of State provides is done so in conformity with state statute. Nothing in those statutes provide for the Ohio Secretary of State consulting with prison officials before exercising authority to provide legal recognition to prisoners, or to providing specific legal recognition or status to prisoners or to the unincorporated associations to which prisoners may belong.

Further, given that the Army of the 12 Monkeys pre-existed my transfer to this prison and pre-existed Chae Harris becoming warden here, it is impossible to get retroactive "permission" to "establish" something that was "established" already:

Dear Warden: Can I start the Army of the 12 Monkeys five years ago at another prison?

5. Approval.

The fact of the matter is, I obtained approval to register both the trade name of the Army of the 12 Monkeys and to register the unincorporated association. Registration of both required the payment of filing fees. Those fees had to be removed from my prison account. To make that happen, I delivered the registration forms, a copy of the Constitution of the Army of the 12 Monkeys (Exhibit 14), and cash slips for both the filing fees associated with registration and for additional postage for mailing these registration requests to the Ohio Secretary of State (Exhibits 15 and 16). I delivered all of that in an unsealed envelope with a request for approval to "the warden's designee!!" The cash slip for the filing fees was both witnessed and approved after being delivered to the warden's designee. The payment for the filings was placed in the envelope by the warden's designee, and the entire mailing was sent off to the Ohio Secretary of State.

By virtue of the fact that payment was sent, and by virtue of the fact that the Ohio Secretary of State received and cashed the payment, I had to have proceeded with approval!! Cash slips cannot be processed without appropriate approval.

I am unaware of what more I could have done to be more approved.

As such, the rationale on the notices of withholding are erroneous and I operated with prior approval.

6. Withholding is Useless.

If I am not mistaken, this is what has occurred: I fashioned legal instruments for filing with the Ohio Secretary of State. I paid the fees for the filing. That agency filed the documents and provided legal recognition of my ownership of the trade name for the Army of the 12 Monkeys and provided recognition of the Army of the 12 Monkeys as an unincorporated association that now has certain legal rights and status afforded to it as a consequence, and I am recognized by that state agency as the "Authorized Agent" of the Army of the 12 Monkeys.

You can withhold the registration forms all day long. Withholding the documents now does absolutely nothing. I already registered the trade name and registered the unincorporated association, and your withholding of these documents at this point in the process does nothing to undo the legal recognition already provided.

As such, you may as well give me the documents. Or not.

Either way, I can proceed as if I have the documents and I can pursue other legal steps whether I possess the documents or not.

7. Withholding forms constitutes interference with official mailings of a state agency.

To my knowledge, the Ohio Secretary of State is not on some terrorist watch list. The Ohio Secretary of State is an elected official conducting legal and statutory business as the head of a state agency.

You have stolen his mail to me.

You have stolen official mail related to legal and statutory business of a state agency. You have done so under the guise that if you permit that state agency to conduct its official business and complete the service of that state agency's official mail, it will somehow cause the prison system to collapse.

That must be the case, since you have no right to interfere with federal mail service otherwise. For you to withhold incoming mail, you must determine that allowing the content of the mail into the prison would constitute a threat to the orderly operation of the prison.

And that means that you will have to articulate how completion of a state agency's official mail that relates to a quasi-legal process of recognition would make your prison fall apart.

Good luck. I have already contacted the Ohio Secretary of State to report the theft of their official state agency mail and the obstruction of their official business. I have also reported it to the Ohio Attorney General. Interfering with official mail of a state agency is a state felony.

8. Obstruction of federal mail.

The state agency official business was sent via federal mail, so obstructing that official business and intercepting the mail of another state agency also constitutes theft of federal mail, a federal felony. I have reported this to the U.S. Attorney in Cincinnati, Ohio.

9. Interference with an Animal Enterprise.

I have registered the Army of the 12 Monkeys as an "animal enterprise" as defined by federal statute. See, "Constitution of the Army of the 12 Monkeys," Exhibit 14, page 1, ¶4.

This means I am now the "Authorized Agent" of a registered "animal enterprise." You are obstructing official mail from a government agency to the Authorized Agent of a registered animal enterprise!!

Interfering with an Animal Enterprise is a federal felony. I would suggest that obstructing official state agency mail from a state agency to an Authorized Agent of a registered animal enterprise would constitute Interference with an Animal Enterprise.

Interference with an Animal Enterprise carries a terrorism specification under federal law. That means by the specification alone, anyone found guilty of Interfering with an Animal Enterprise must be sentenced, on the specification alone, to no less than 20 years in federal prison!!

I have contacted federal law enforcement authorities to report what may be Interference with an Animal Enterprise and will be urging radio listeners and internet website viewers to call and email federal authorities to demand an investigation into this federal felony that may well constitute terrorism.

10. Unresolvable Quagmire.

Apart from giving me the forms back, withholding them will create an unresolvable quagmire. Consider, that in order to "destroy" these documents in ten days, WCI will have to first obtain permission from the county probate court. I have already notified that court of my intention to challenge any request for any such order, which will likely result in a court hearing where I will notify the court that the documents in question are official documents sent from a state agency in the conduct of its official business; and I will notify the court that the withholding and destruction of those documents will likely constitute several state and federal crimes.

Permission from the court, I suspect, will not be forthcoming-- which means you will then have to give the documents back anyway.

The other option is to forego legal justification for destroying the documents and to simply destroy them the way that Mr. Burchell destroyed my legal documents turned in for copies. That destruction has resulted in a Court of Claims case scheduled for trial in January, where the state stands to lose \$50,000. Further, the filing of the case resulted in the representation of the Ohio Attorney General, which cost the ODRC \$12,000 from its general operating budget. The extra-legal destruction of these withhold forms will also lead to the filing of a court of claims case that will also cost \$12,000.

And, apart from that, I will simply contact the Ohio Secretary of State and get another copy of those documents sent to me.


CONCLUSION

Official documents from a state agency related to official business were withheld and notice was provided on improper forms that articulate a rationale for withholding that is not one of the criteria permitted by administrative rules. The mailroom has confused registration of trademarks and registration of an unincorporated association with "business activity," related to a group that was already "established," and for registration that your courts have already determined prison officials have no interest in regulating-- which is why the Secretary of State did not consult prison officials before approving registration. Further, the withholding is undertaken with the assumption that I did not have prior approval, when I did, and is undertaken with the assumption that if the forms are withheld, the recognition already bestowed can somehow be un-bestowed-- which it cannot. Further still, withholding constitutes obstruction of official business of a state agency, theft of U.S. mail, and interference with an animal enterprise-- all crimes. And finally, if the institution seeks to withhold the the mail and get a court order to

destroy it, that will lead to getting embroiled in endless and mind-numbing litigation that the institution cannot win, and will result in me getting the forms sent to me through some other means anyway.

So, based on the foregoing, I ask that this matter be resolved by serving me the state agency official mail that has been withheld without any reasonable or legal basis.

The kiosk will not permit me to open another original grievance. Be advised that AR 5120-9-31 places no limit on grievances and federal courts mandate access. So, please construe the following as an original grievance against Warden Chae Harris.

I am selectively compelled by new re-definition of rules to get prior approval from the warden before I "conduct business." This new re-interpretation began on 31 October when the mailroom used an improper and outdated form from 1995 to steal mail from me from a state agency, under the guise of "conducting business," as if the Ohio Secretary of State awarded me a government contract.

As receipt of mail is "conducting business," I must interpret that all other exemptions previously recognized by the prison are also revoked, so that any event requiring my signature or consent now constitutes "conducting business."

When I spoke to Warden Harris, he advised me to consult the inmate handbook. I read it cover to cover. It says nothing about scanning my identification in exchange for a food tray, or scanning my identification to consent to purchases from commissary, or placing my signature on any document that becomes, de facto, a contract by virtue of the signature. It does say I can send and receive mail, which is clearly out the window if a state agency sends me documents that the prison doesn't like.

Recourse to stealing mail under such a pretext is NOT in the inmate handbook.

It is in this context that I have sent, so far, 67 kites to Warden Harris to get prior approval for activities that are, de facto, "conducting business" under the new re-invention of the rule that YOU have imposed. He has not provided prior approval for any of the events in those kites for which I have requested prior approval.

As a consequence, I have no prior approval to scan my identification for meals, for commissary; I have no prior approval to sign for legal mail or for outgoing mail; I have no prior approval for consenting to removal of funds from my phone account in exchange for a call, or for purchasing emails on the kiosk. Warden Harris withholding his prior approval essentially forbids me from doing any of those activities. If I perform those actions, I would be "conducting business" and subject to disciplinary action.

In this original grievance, I challenge the propriety of Warden Harris withholding his prior approval to permit me to scan my identification in exchange for breakfast on 19 Nov 17.

RELIEF REQUESTED: A finding that Warden Harris must timely answer the 67 kites and provide answers to my requests for prior approval before food service scanners are re-deployed and I starve to death. ■

The kiosk will not permit me to open another original grievance. Be advised that AR 5120-9-31 places no limit on grievances and federal courts mandate access. So, please construe the following as an original grievance against Warden Chae Harris.

I am selectively compelled by new re-definition of rules to get prior approval from the warden before I "conduct business." This new re-interpretation began on 31 October when the mailroom used an improper and outdated form from 1995 to steal mail from me from a state agency, under the guise of "conducting business," as if the Ohio Secretary of State awarded me a government contract.

As receipt of mail is "conducting business," I must interpret that all other exemptions previously recognized by the prison are also revoked, so that any event requiring my signature or consent now constitutes "conducting business."

When I spoke to Warden Harris, he advised me to consult the inmate handbook. I read it cover to cover. It says nothing about scanning my identification in exchange for a food tray, or scanning my identification to consent to purchases from commissary, or placing my signature on any document that becomes, de facto, a contract by virtue of the signature. It does say I can send and receive mail, which is clearly out the window if a state agency sends me documents that the prison doesn't like.

Recourse to stealing mail under such a pretext is NOT in the inmate handbook.

It is in this context that I have sent, so far, 67 kites to Warden Harris to get prior approval for activities that are, de facto, "conducting business" under the new re-invention of the rule that YOU have imposed. He has not provided prior approval for any of the events in those kites for which I have requested prior approval.

As a consequence, I have no prior approval to scan my identification for meals, for commissary; I have no prior approval to sign for legal mail or for outgoing mail; I have no prior approval for consenting to removal of funds from my phone account in exchange for a call, or for purchasing emails on the kiosk. Warden Harris withholding his prior approval essentially forbids me from doing any of those activities. If I perform those actions, I would be "conducting business" and subject to disciplinary action.

In this original grievance, I challenge the propriety of Warden Harris withholding his prior approval to permit me to scan my identification in exchange for breakfast on 19 Nov 17.
